

**RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF INCREASING THE
STATEWIDE MINIMUM WAGE IN CALIFORNIA**

WHEREAS, California has an estimated 4.9 million low-wage workers, and more than 6.3 million workers in California lack the resources they need to meet their basic needs, with more than 1.6 million workers relying on food stamps to supplement their income; and

WHEREAS, The rising cost of living and housing in California disproportionately impacts low-income workers, increasing the need for them to work two or three jobs to make ends meet; and

WHEREAS, Increases in the minimum wage lead to better mental health outcomes and lower suicide rates in low-wage workers, help reduce racial and gender wage gaps, and benefit local economies due to the fact that when low-wage workers receive a pay increase, they are more likely than higher-wage earners to spend it; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Democratic County Central Committee (SFDCCC) supports efforts to increase the California minimum wage to keep pace with the cost of living in California.

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF AB 587, SOCIAL MEDIA CORPORATE POLICIES

WHEREAS, Californians are becoming increasingly alarmed about the role of social media in promoting hate, disinformation, conspiracy theories, and extreme political polarization; and

WHEREAS, In recent years, social media platforms have been implicated as a venue for hate groups to safely grow and misinformation/disinformation to quickly and easily spread, and

WHEREAS, Despite widespread concerns, efforts by social media companies to self-police have been widely criticized as inadequate; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Democratic County Central Committee supports Assembly Bill 587 introduced by Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel (D – Woodland Hills) and co-authored by Assemblymembers Bauer-Kahan, Lee, McCarty, Robert Rivas, Ward, Wicks, and Senator Scott Wiener, which will require social media platforms to publicly disclose their corporate policies regarding online hate, disinformation, extremism, harassment, and foreign interference, as well as key metrics and data regarding the enforcement of those policies; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Resolution be forwarded to the California State Legislature and the office of Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel.
